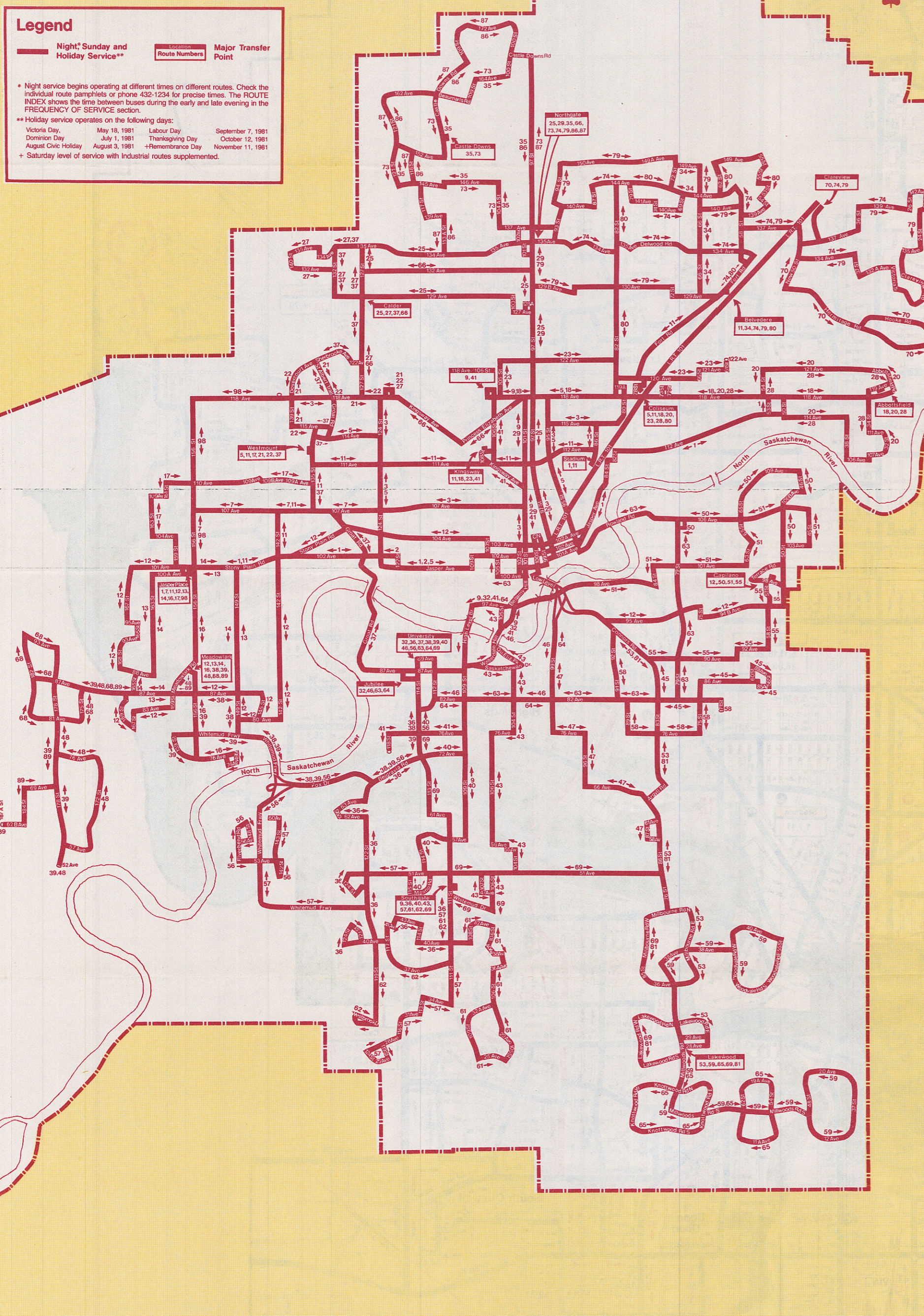


Night, Sunday, and Holiday Map

Where you see this sign, we've got your new Monthly Transit Pass

If you ride with us several times a week, economize with a Monthly Transit Pass. Passes are available for \$18.00 a month on more than 150 routes all over Edmonton. A Monthly Transit Pass entitles you to unlimited travel throughout the month on any of our bus and LRT routes, and it's transferable to anyone in your family to use too. Park us in your pocket!

School Passes
School passes are available during the school year for elementary and secondary students attending Edmonton Public and Separate Schools. These passes can be purchased only from the school the student attends, and allow children to ride yellow schoolbuses or regular Transit buses to and from school.

"Student Pak"
Post-secondary students in Edmonton colleges can obtain discounted packages of four regular monthly passes. The "Student Pak" is offered late in the previous month for \$65.00 to buy the four months' passes - January to April, May to August, September to December. Bring your student I.D. card or course registration to buy your "Student Pak" at any of the student stores or box office outlets at Grant MacEwan Community College, NAIT, University of Alberta, The King's College and Alberta College.

Watch for the Helping Hand
Monthly Passes are available downtown, in the west end, and on the north and south sides of Edmonton. Look for the symbol where you bank or shop, for example:

Financial Institutions
Many of the following banks offer Edmonton Transit Monthly Passes - ask at your branch, Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce, Royal Bank, and Toronto-Dominion Bank. Selected branches of the Bank of Montreal, Bank of Nova Scotia and Bank of British Columbia also carry passes.

CREDIT UNIONS
Ask at branches of the following credit unions: Amalgamated Savings and Credit Union, Belmont Credit Union, Alberta Credit Union, Edmonton Savings and Credit Union, Provincial Employees Credit Union, Chinatown Credit Union, Roylegger Savings and Credit Union and Union Credit Union.

TRUST COMPANIES
Look for monthly passes at Canada Permanent Trust, Canada Trust, City Savings and Trust, Commerce Capital Trust, Heritage Savings and Trust, Northwest Trust, Heritage Trust, and Royal Trust branches.

Retail Outlets
From corner groceries, and smoke shops to department stores - watch to find a convenient outlet. Smoke shops include Cambridge and Capital Square, Haro's and Hub City, Klonke and Mr. Mike's News and Smokes and Mike's News, Pro-Smoke and West Den. Ask at customer service desks in The Bay, Eaton's, Woodward's Stores throughout the city, and at Londreys Mail. Drug stores and groceries include Leonard's, Lord Byron Foods, Mitchell Drugs, Moonlight Grocery, Myo's Pharmacy, Natta's Foods, Spedway Drugs, Top's Foods, Western Drugs, and Windsor Park Market.

Educational Institutions
Monthly Passes and Student Paks are offered at major campus bookstores or ticket outlets, such as Grant MacEwan Community College, NAIT, King's College, and in St. Albans at University of Alberta.

Other Outlets
Certain social service and community agencies sell Monthly Transit Passes: Capilano Social Service, Paralympic Sports Association, West 10, and provincial regional offices. City Hall, Church LRT Station's pass centre, Westwood Garage and Edmonton Transit's Administration Building also sell Monthly Passes.

We offer two services to help you obtain route and schedule information about our buses and LRT.
In person, pick up route pamphlets and other Transit materials at Transit's Downtown Information Centre, 100 A Street on Jasper Avenue. It's open Monday to Friday 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and Saturday 9:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.
Elsewhere in Edmonton, Transit's route pamphlets are available at all public libraries, at the University of Alberta's SUB and HUB offices, at all city visitor bureaus, information offices at all Grant MacEwan Community College campuses, at various shopping centre information desks, at City Hall information desk and all Edmonton Transit garages. You can also write Edmonton Transit Administration 10426-81 Avenue, Edmonton T6E 1A5. By telephone, schedule and route information is available daily from our information operators. Call 432-1234 Monday to Saturday, 6:30 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. Sundays and holidays 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. They'll help you plan your trip, best route, schedule and connections, and where to catch the bus. It's as easy as dialing 432-1234.

Regional Service

The City of St. Albert and the County of Strathcona operate bus systems that connect to Edmonton Transit services. Connecting service is shown on the Weekday Map, reverse side of the Guide. St. Albert Transit passes are accepted on St. Albert buses only. St. Albert passes may be used to obtain a transfer to an Edmonton Transit bus only when the trip originates on a St. Albert bus. Edmonton Transit passes are not valid to and from St. Albert.
Edmonton Transit's monthly transit passes are acceptable as part fare on trips to Sherwood Park but not for trips from Sherwood Park to Edmonton. Information for both regional carriers is available by calling Edmonton Transit's information number, 432-1234, City of St. Albert Engineering Department, 659-8601, or County of Strathcona Transportation Department, 464-RIDE.

Special Services

Disabled Adult Transportation System (D.A.T.S.)
D.A.T.S. provides public transportation to disabled individuals, 16 years of age and over, who are unable to use existing Transit facilities and who register with the service. The service gives door-to-door transportation using specially equipped vehicles. Priority is given to those who use D.A.T.S. for work, education, and rehabilitation trips. To register, call 428-5592. For information and cancellations, call 474-7665. For service requests, trip bookings and complaints, call 474-8103.

Park and Ride, Shuttle Service
Edmonton Transit operates Park and Ride Service for major events with advance ticket sales of over 16,000. Frequent service from several convenient locations begins 1 1/2 hours before and immediately after each event. Ticket and Ride Service now operate for all Edmonton Eskimo football games at Commonwealth Stadium.
Other events receive Park and Ride or Shuttle Service as they meet the above guidelines. The public is notified of the locations of parking lots and operating times through advertisements or by calling information, 432-1234.

Charters
Buses may be chartered from Edmonton Transit at reasonable rates for trips anywhere within an 80 kilometer radius of the City of Edmonton limits. Charter service is available for sports events, sightseeing, conventions and group travel. A public address system can be provided at no extra charge. Buses seat 50 passengers.
Edmonton Transit has a small number of historic buses and trolleycoaches available for charter service. Special conditions apply to this unique service, and availability of the vehicles can not be guaranteed. Booking these vehicles should be made at least one month in advance. For information on all charters call 428-5590 during regular business hours.

Weekday Map

All regularly scheduled bus routes and Light Rail Transit (LRT) operated by Edmonton Transit are displayed on the Weekday Map. Colour-coded routes on the Weekday Map give the following information: Morning (for exact times check individual route brochures or contact information, 432-1234) to evening (check the Night, Sunday and Holiday Map) service which routes windhead (the evenings).
Red - Peak hour service. These routes run in the morning and evening during rush hour only (for exact times, check individual route brochures or contact information, 432-1234).

Route Index

The Route Index (other side of the Guide) shows all routes in numerical sequence. The Frequency of Service section indicates frequency during different times of the day. The Route Index also shows the special information affecting certain routes. The Route Origin section indicates the destination sign found on the upper front of the bus.
The destination sign system used by Edmonton Transit consists of a route number and area to which the vehicle is going. The area name as shown on the front of the bus is the same as destinations listed in the Route Index. Further information can be seen on a card through the buses windshield.

Night, Sunday, Holiday Map

The Night, Sunday, Holiday Map (left of this section) displays the routes that operate on Saturdays and statutory holidays (the routes are listed in the map's index).

City Centre Circulation Map

The City Centre Map (bottom of this section) gives a detailed view of bus movements in the City Centre.

Transit Operators do not carry change. To avoid delays have exact change ready before boarding. Coin-operated turnstiles on all LRT stations will not accept dollar bills.

Transfer Policy

A valid transfer is accepted as full fare on an Edmonton Transit bus routes and Light Rail Transit (LRT). Transfers must be requested at the time the fare is paid and must be used by the person to whom it is issued. A transfer can be used to take an Edmonton Transit service within one hour of issue. This allows for return trips, stopping in the middle of a trip without having to pay an extra fare, and to provide single fare payment for connections between two points not served by a single route.

Senior Citizens Transit Passes

The Senior Citizen Courtesy Pass is a lifetime pass available to Edmonton residents 65 years of age or over, their spouses and spouses of deceased citizens. With the pass, all rides are free on Edmonton Transit, St. Albert, and the County of Strathcona systems. Senior Citizen Courtesy passes are available for a \$5.00 administration fee from the Customer Service centre located in the north mezzanine area of the Churchill Transit Station. Office hours are from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Mondays through Fridays, except on civic holidays. For further information, call 424-1617.

Courtesy Seating

As a service to senior citizens and other patrons who may have mobility problems the front bench seat and first forward facing seat in each of our buses has been designated for use by these individuals. Edmonton Transit looks forward to cooperation from all patrons respecting this priority seating policy.

Lost and Found

Articles left on transit vehicles are turned over to the Lost and Found office located in the Customer Service centre in the north mezzanine area of the Churchill Transit Station. The Lost and Found office is open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Mondays through Fridays, except on civic holidays.
To claim a lost article, you must know the route number that you were riding and the date of the loss. For inquiries about Lost and Found items, phone 428-5514.

Transit Bylaw

For the convenience and comfort of Edmonton Transit riders, you are reminded that it is illegal to smoke, eat, or drink in a bus, bus shelters, LRT vehicles and stations. Bylaw number 5553 governs the conduct of passengers on Edmonton Transit vehicles and property. Copies of the bylaw are available on request from the City Clerk's Office.

Travel Tips For Buses

- Edmonton Transit Operators do their best to maintain strict schedules so that you can arrive at your destination safely and on time. The following tips on bus travel will make your trip smoother.
- Use caution when entering and leaving the bus. For the convenience of those boarding, please exit by the rear door whenever possible.
- Large or clumsy carry-on articles can be hazardous to yourself and others. Before boarding with such items, ask the Operator.
- Have your fare ready (in exact change), transit pass or a transfer when you board the bus. Operators do not carry change or handle money.
- When you need to take more than one bus to reach your destination, ask the Operator for a transfer when you pay your cash fare. Present the transfer to the Operator and retain it as a record bus when boarding. If you wish to retain a transfer without valid time remaining, show it to the Operator and tell him or her that you wish to retain your transfer. Do not put transfers into fareboxes or LRT receipt vending machines. Remember that you can connect from bus to LRT, or from LRT to bus, by using a transfer.
- When approaching your destination, signal the Operator to stop by putting hand out above the window.
- When boarding, step to the back of the bus to permit free flow of passengers to exits. Avoid talking to the Operator unless you need to ask for information.
- Noisy radios and tape players can be disturbing to other passengers and distracting for the Operator. Use earphones and enjoy the music while other enjoy the silence.
- Be courteous to others by not smoking, eating, drinking, or littering. Do not board animals except seeing eye dogs.

Travel Tips For LRT

Edmonton Transit's Light Rail Transit (LRT) complements the bus system. All LRT stations have direct connections with buses. The fare for buses and LRT is the same and transfers can be made from one to the other on a single fare by using Proof of Payment (POP) fare receipts from the LRT or transfers issued by bus Operators.

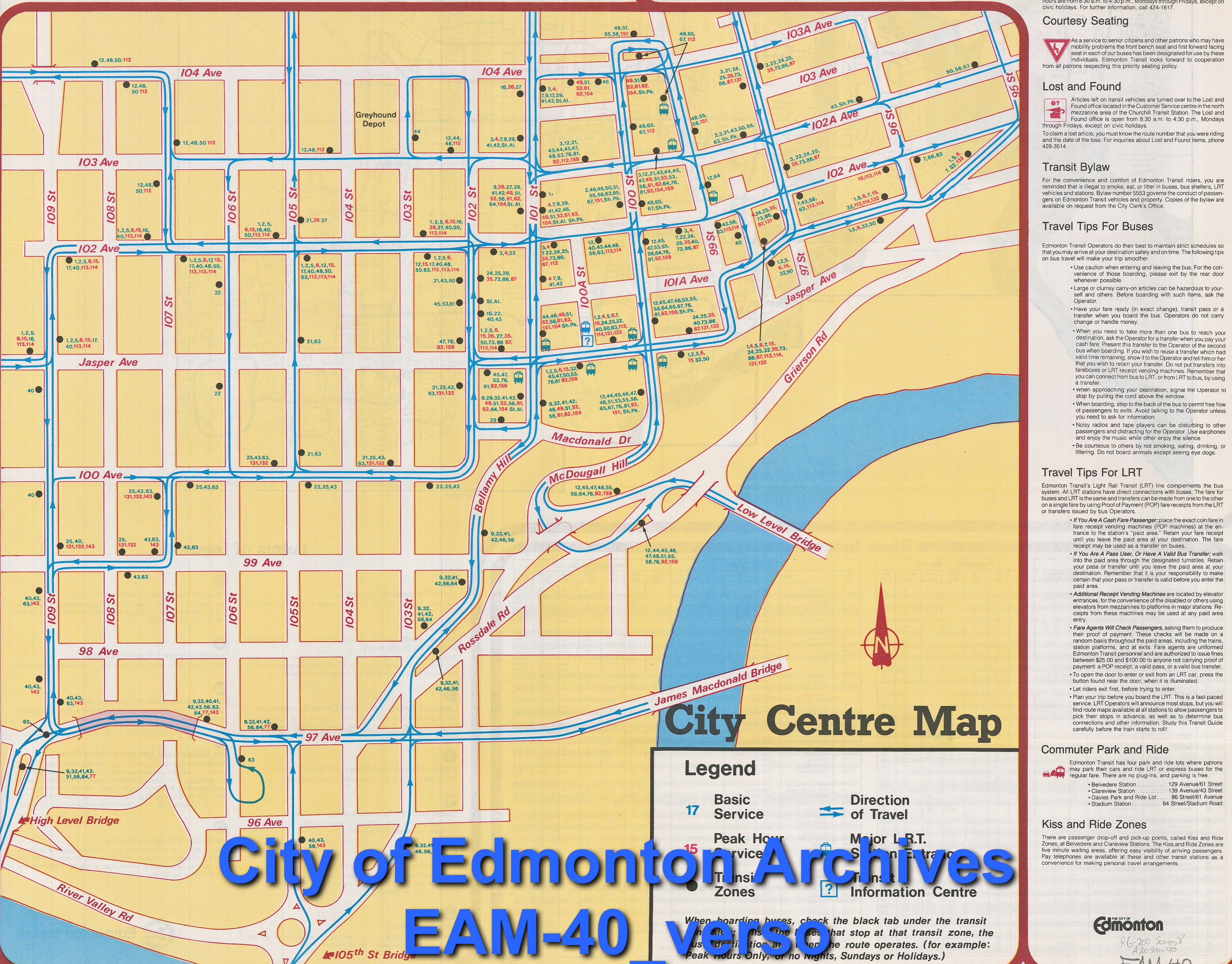
- If you are a Cash Fare Passenger, place the exact coin fare in fare receipt vending machines (ROP machines) at the entrance to the station's paid area. Retain your fare receipt until you leave the paid area at your destination. The fare receipt may be used as a transfer on buses.
- If you are a Pass User, Or Have a Valid Bus Transfer, walk into the paid area through the designated turnstiles. Retain your pass or transfer until you leave the paid area at your destination. Remember that it is your responsibility to make certain that your pass or transfer is valid before you enter the paid area.
- Additional Receipt Vending Machines are located on elevators/receptacles, for the convenience of the disabled or other using elevators from mezzanines to platforms in major stations. Receipts from these machines may be used at any paid area entry.
- Fare Agents Will Check Passengers, asking them to produce their proof of payment. These checks will be made on a random basis throughout the paid areas, including the transit station platforms, and at exits. Fare agents are uniformed Edmonton Transit personnel and are authorized to issue fines between \$25.00 and \$100.00 to anyone not carrying proof of payment (a POP receipt, a valid pass, or a valid bus transfer).
- To open the door to enter or exit from an LRT car, press the button found near the door, when it is illuminated.
- Let riders exit first, before trying to enter.
- Plan your trip before you board the LRT. This is a fast-paced service. LRT Operators will announce most stops, but you will not have much time to board. Please allow passengers to pick their stops in advance, as well as to determine bus connections and other information. Study this Transit Guide carefully before the train starts to roll.

Commuter Park and Ride

- Edmonton Transit has four park and ride lots where patrons may park their cars and ride LRT or express buses for the regular fare. There are no plug-ins, and parking is free.
- Bevedere Station: 129 Avenue/61 Street
- Clareview Station: 139 Avenue/43 Street
- Daves Park and Ride Lot: 86 Street/61 Avenue
- Stadium Station: 84 Street/Stadium Road

Kiss and Ride Zones

There are passenger drop-off and pick-up points, called Kiss and Ride Zones, at Bevedere and Clareview Stations. The Kiss and Ride Zones are five minute waiting areas, offering easy visibility of arriving passengers. Pay telephones are available at these and other transit stations as a convenience for making personal travel arrangements.
