6. Capital Expenditures 1938 & Dominion Loan

"(a) The Hon. W. A. Fallow, Provincial Minister of Public Works and Mr. J. F. Percival, Deputy Provincial Treasurer, visited Ottawa recently with a view to obtaining loans under the Municipal Improvements Assistance Act whereby the Dominion Government is authorized to loan money at 2% to municipalities for works for the relief of unemployment and of a self-liquidating character. Mr. J. A. MacKinnon, M. P., very kindly helped with our representations and we believe our proposals were given every consideration."

MOVED Ald. Paterson,

That this be received as information.

"(b) Your Commissioners had prepared a list of works totalling \$690,000. with the idea of having the Dominion Officials tentatively approve of as many items as possible. Certain limitations, however, ruled out most of the items submitted. In the first place our borrowings will be limited to a total of \$237,500., being at the rate of \$3.00 per capita on the 1937 census. Projects must be shown to give a maximum of relief of unemployment; they must be shown to be self-liquidating and the money cannot be used for any work completed prior to the signing of agreements. The Government has

"agreed to finance certain street railway, waterworks and electric light improvements, but the work remaining to be done on the Power Plant and Telephone extensions could hardly be shown to employ sufficient local labor. After some negotiations the Government tentatively agreed to loan up to \$60,000. for the local improvement share only of new paving - the City to finance the cost of its own share. Unfortunately this is generally the larger part."

"(c) These were all the items that were tentatively agreed to, and it may be difficult to show proper qualifications for the loan outside of the items mentioned. Fortunately these items all form part of the original table of works on which the estimate of \$2,700,000. was based and provided for capital construction under the Fortin Plan. Thus it will not be necessary to enlarge our total capital program beyond the amount originally contemplated under the Plan. The advantages are that there will be a saving of 2 1/2% on the amount so borrowed, and it will make available Sinking Fund investments to a corresponding amount to reduce further the City's Capital Debt."

"(e) The Street Railway work has already been fully reported upon. While the amount to be expended may seem large it is intended to cover three years so that it is only equal to what we have been spending annually for some years past on the orderly rehabilitation of the system. It is anticipated that the change-over will result in an increase of surplus earnings to the extent of \$13,000 as against the annual debenture payment of \$9,137 to the Dominion Government. The cost of the buses, estimated from \$110,000 to \$120,000 will be paid for out of Utility Reserves during the three year period - \$70,000 has already been set aside."

The addition to the Waterworks Workshop is required by expanding business and the inadequacy of the present meter room and workshop.

The item in regard to Electric Light is part of the \$30,000 already passed by Council for that Department."




